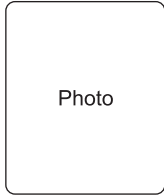

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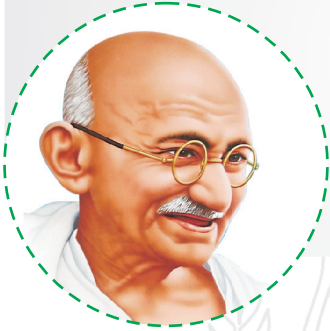

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

ATTENDANCE

For the successful completion of the academic programme, regular attendance is imperative. Therefore,

- (a) Students should obtain previous permission of the class teacher for not attending the class. If previous permission is not obtained due to unavoidable circumstances, an application for leave should be sent to the class teacher through the school diary.
- (b) The application for leave should be signed by the parent.
- (c) Leave for more than 3 continuous days are permitted only on medical ground.
- (d) Application for leave on medical ground must be supported by a medical certificate.
- (e) Students suffering from infectious diseases will not be allowed to attend the classes .
- (f) Unauthorized absence for a period of 15 working days will result in the removal of the pupil's name from the roll without any intimation to the parent.
- (g) No student who has less than 80% attendance to his/her credit in a particular academic year shall be considered for promotion.
- (h) Continued absence may be condoned at the discretion of the school Advisory council.

TESTS & EXAMINATIONS

1. About Remodeled Assessment structure : The CBSE has decided to introduce a new assessment scheme to evaluate the performance of students with a clear view of improving the academic quality of students. There will be three periodic tests of 10 marks for grade IX & X. The average of the best two tests will be taken. The annual examination will be for '80' marks. The portions will be cumulatively covered for

periodic tests and 100% syllabus will be covered for annual exam. For classes from VI-VIII, there will be two terminal examinations with two periodic tests. The periodic tests will be cumulative in nature and the second terminal examination will cover the entire portions. The students need to get minimum 33% marks for promotion in both tests and Terminal Examination. 5 marks goes to Notebook maintenance and another 5 marks goes to subject enrichment activities.

2. A student not appearing in the tests will be marked absent and would be discredited for the same.
3. As per the new assessment structure, absentees in any tests may not be given retests.
5. Class work, home work, practicals, seminars, projects etc, which are given due weightage in the annual promotion, need to be regularly monitored by the parents.
6. A pupil who has arrears of fee or dues of any other kind will not be permitted to sit for the examination.
7. Request for separate or special examinations other than what the school has envisaged will not be entertained on any grounds.
8. There will be no provision for a supplementary test or a re-test for candidates who have been declared detained in a class after the annual examination.

PROMOTION CRITERIA

Pupils are promoted on the basis of the performance of the student across the year. Promotion is strictly based on securing the minimum pass percentage applicable for each class and as per the guidelines issued by the CBSE from time to time.

A pupil may not be allowed to appear for the Annual Examination if he/she has not put in a minimum 80% of the attendance of the academic session (including, attendance put in the previous school, if the student has been admitted on transfer). It is compulsory for students of all classes to appear for the examination for promotion to the next higher class.

The result that are declared after the Annual examination will not be reconsidered under any circumstances and no detained student will be given a promotion

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Adequate emphasis has been given to non-scholastic activities as envisaged in our National Education Policy so that the children are offered ample opportunities to realize their aptitude, develop their creative talents, and thus evolve a wholesome personality.

Activities offered are:

1. Physical Education Programme:

Regular physical education programmes are being implemented in the school. Coaching facilities in athletics and games will also be provided.

2. Training in Fine Arts

The school will offer special training in fine art forms like drawing, Painting, Clay Modelling, Music and Dance in order to encourage the latent talents in students.

3. Clubs

Student of class I and above shall enroll themselves in any one of the following clubs:

- a) Literary Club (Language)
- b) Maths Club (Ramanujan Mathematics Club)
- c) Science Club (Scienica)
- d) Social Club (Team Enviro)

4. Literary & Cultural Meet

Literary and cultural meet will be organized every year with a view to identify, honour and refine the creative literary and cultural talents of the children. Children with talents reported in these events will be encouraged to participate at the higher level of competitions.

5. Celebrations

Important celebrations like Teachers' day, Children's Day, Science Day, Independence Day, Republic Day, Arts Day, Sports Day, Annual Day etc. are conducted to enhance the feeling of belonging and worth in our children.

6. Trips & Tours

Every year the school conducts various Field Trips and Educational Tours. This will be mapped with the scholastic lessons as far as possible. All the students need to participate.

7. Conveyance Facility

The school has conveyance facility. Students desirous of availing of the facility should renew their request every year. Conveyance fee should be paid in advance. The rates and routes will be fixed in due course. If a student intends to discontinue the facility, he/she should give one month's prior notice or one month's conveyance charge in lieu thereof.

8. P.T.A.

All parents / guardians are members of the Association. All parents/ guardians should unhesitatingly put forward their valuable suggestions and voluntarily contribute their service for the betterment of the school and their wards.

9. Open House Session

The school conducts Open House Sessions after every Periodic test and Annual Exam in the first and second terms in which all the parents /guardians of the students of the school are expected to attend without fail. Progress Reports of students will be distributed in the session. Parents can have a face to face meeting regarding the performance of their wards with the teachers concerned. This will enable them to realize the strengths and weaknesses of their wards.

APPEAL TO PARENTS / GUARDIANS

We can do wonders for our children only with the whole hearted co-operation of the parents/guardians in the following areas:-

- a) Providing essential amenities and facilities for effective studies at home, e.g. necessary texts, note books and other stationery and a fixed time and place for regular studies.
- b) You are requested to give your wards necessary guidance in doing their homework/ assignment/project work and ensure the submission of the same in time.
- c) In order to provide the best of services, we request you to remit the school fees and conveyance charges in time as per the rules. All payments should be made to the Office and receipts thereof should be obtained and retained.
- d) Your help is also sought in ensuring that your ward comes to school in proper

uniform, neat and ironed dresses, clean and polished shoes, fitting socks and neatly combed and tied hair. clipped nails etc.,

- e) You are requested to go through the School diary regularly to monitor the progress of your ward. The diary should be checked for remarks if any, made by the teacher or the Principal and duly signed by you.
- f) Parents are earnestly requested to sign the Progress Reports / Answer Papers / Similar documents whenever required. Failure of doing so may put their children and teachers to great inconvenience and will result in the pupil being not permitted to enter the class/ school for which the school disclaims responsibility. Therefore all circulars and other information sent to you from the school must be read and acknowledgment should be sent to school as and where required.
- g) Report cards must be duly signed by the parents / guardians and returned to the class teacher within one week of its issue.
- h) Any form of criticism of a teacher or the School in the presence of the child should be strictly avoided, so that students do not lose respect for his/her teacher.
- i) Genuine complaints about the School may be directly reported to the Principal .
- j) All parents/guardians are most welcome to the school to enquire about the progress of their wards and register genuine grievances and meet the teachers. They are required to seek prior permission from the Principal of the School. In order to avoid inconvenience, parents are requested to come on Saturdays to meet the teachers.
- k) Parents are not allowed to go to the class rooms directly and meet the teachers. Teachers will not entertain any parent through phone while they are engaged in their duties.
- l) If the children are to be taken home after the class with the any one other than their parents/guardians, identity of such people should be ascertained to the Class-in-charge with an authorization letter. No child will be sent home alongwith a person, even if related, if his/ her identity is not known before.
- m) No request for short leave by parents/guardians to take their child home early will be entertained. In case of emergency, the parent with the permission of the Principal, may escort the student.
- n) Kindly ensure that your ward reaches school in time and also reaches home after school in time. Any irregularity in this case must be reported to the Principal.

- o) Parents are requested not to send their wards to School if they are suffering from any contagious disease.
- p) Parents are requested to notify the School Authorities of any change of address or telephone number.
- q) The Principal is empowered to request/demand the withdrawal of a student or to remove the name of a student from the School rolls if the progress, behaviour or conduct of such a student is unsatisfactory.
- r) Students will not be allowed to leave the school in the middle of the school hours on the request of anyone unless it is very urgent. (Death case, unexpected medical issue, etc.)
- s) **All communication, including fee payments, homework assignments, and other school-related messages, will be shared through our school app. Please ensure that all parents have installed the school app to receive alerts and notifications.**

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Students should reach the school 5 minutes before the first bell.
- 2. Students must be punctual for the school assembly
- 3. Late comers and absentees should bring the late attendance and absence record duly signed by their parents.
- 4. No dress other than school uniform is allowed within the premises even on birthdays. Wearing of school badge is compulsory on all days.
- 5. Cleanliness in person and clothes is expected of every child.
- 6. Rings, bracelets, bangles, fancy ear-rings, costly ornaments, coloured hair-bands and hair_clips are not to be worn. Girls are not to wear any kind of facial make up, grow long nails and use nail polish. Boys must have their hair neatly cut short. Girls with long hair must wear two plaits with black ribbon tie-ups. None is permitted to wear any fancy hair styles.
- 7. No valuable articles should be brought to the school. Students are not permitted to have CELL PHONES on the school campus. Books, bags and tiffin boxes, umbrellas and other personal belongings should bear the name and class of the owner. Students are responsible for the safe custody of their books and belongings. The school will not be responsible for the loss of personal property brought to school by the students. Any article found on the premises of the school has to be handed over

8. Application for leave should be entered in the pages provided in the diary and should be duly signed by the parent/guardian.
9. Students should be fully equipped with necessary text books, note books, pencil, eraser and other class accessories.
10. Any student who wants to be exempted from P.T. or games must produce his / her parent's appeal to the effect that the/she is physically unfit to take part.
11. Students are not allowed to receive visitors. They are not allowed to make phone calls unless the school seems it necessary. They will not be permitted to answer phone calls also. However, urgent messages shall be passed on to them.
12. All correspondence addressed to pupils are subject to inspection.
13. Students may not offer presents to their teachers except in those circumstances sanctioned by the Principal.
14. Every student will be provided with a school diary. All communications of a routine nature from school authorities to the parents/guardians will be through this diary.
15. Every student must bring the school diary to the class daily. It should not be used as a rough book. Pages therein should not be torn off.
16. Students are expected to keep the premises clean and tidy. Damage caused by the school property will have to be paid for.
17. Participation and attendance in all activities of the school is compulsory. Students should participate with discipline and team spirit, acquire qualities of recognising and acknowledging others and develop in them an attitude to serve others.
18. Homework and assignments shall be regularly done and submitted.
19. Students are strictly forbidden to go out of the Campus during the school hours for whatever reason, without prior permission from the Principal.
20. Class monitors shall maintain the class discipline in the absence of the teacher. All students should co-operate with the monitor in maintaining discipline of the class.
21. No student shall loiter in the school and disturb other classes. Free time is to be properly utilized in the Reading room and Library.
22. Students should behave themselves with utmost dignity, politeness and courtesy both inside and outside the school. They should remember that the reputation of the institution lies in their gentlemanly behaviour. Politeness and courtesy are expected from pupils.
23. Indifference towards any subject, discourtesy towards any member of the staff, or any act which affects the discipline or tone of the school will be viewed seriously.
24. Any violation of discipline, or of the high ideals for which our school stands for, will invite disciplinary action. Habitual negligence in school work, tardiness, dishonesty or other acts of misconduct will entail severe disciplinary action which in extreme cases will result in expulsion of the student from the school.



25. The school reserves the right to dismiss a pupil on grounds of irregular attendance, disobedience to teachers, any kind of malpractice or objectionable behaviour, or misconduct in the school premises or elsewhere.
26. Behaviour outside school hours: Although parents are responsible for the behaviour of their children outside school hours, the school will take necessary action when such behaviour is reported to be immoral or violent.
27. No collection of money or parties/treats by students on any grounds is permitted without the prior sanction of the Principal.
28. Results declared at the end of the academic year are final and indisputable.

30. Management reserves the right to amend by adding, modifying, deleting or substituting any of the standing rules.
31. Parents/guardiana are not allowed inside the school premise during the school hours without prior permission from the Principal
